



Key stage 2 results - summer 2019: an extract from our Trust Annual review provides a summary of our results

Overall, across reading, writing, maths, as well as spelling, punctuation and grammar, a higher percentage of our children than nationally reached the 'Expected Standard' - an excellent result, of which our children and staff are rightly proud.

In terms of the 'Higher Score' (ie. the percentage of the children who not only reached the 'Expected Standard', but who were assessed as working well beyond that), in reading, writing, maths and spelling, punctuation and grammar, a higher percentage of our children than nationally reached this 'Higher Score' level. **Particularly impressive was our children's combined reading, writing and maths combined 'Higher Score' level, which at 27%, is more than double the national level in this category (which is 11%).** This is indicative of the high quality teaching at our school, where every child is challenged to make the best possible progress, and is a credit to both our children and to our staff team.

Finally, our high progress scores provided evidence of the excellent teaching and learning at our school.

Key Stage 2 information - for the academic year ended summer 2018

As communicated to parents and carers in the [news item published on the 21 December 2018](#), we are now able to share our validated results which indicate that:

- 87% of Year 6 children reached the 'expected standard' across reading, writing and maths - a fantastic result, which puts us in the top 15% of all 92 schools and colleges in Newham, and well above both the figure in London (70%) and a full 23% above the 64% national figure.
- In addition, 25% of our year 6 children reached the more challenging 'higher standard' in all 3 areas - an even more remarkable achievement, which puts us in the top 7.5% of schools in Newham and above the national figure of 10%.

Broken down by subject area, the results were equally impressive, with our children's performance between 9 and 18% above national results across the four areas assessed. Details for each area are as follows:

- In reading, 93% of the children met the expected standard (18% above the 75% national score)
- In maths, 93% of the children met the expected standard (17% above the 76% national score)
- In GPS (grammar, punctuation and spelling) 87% of the children met the expected standard (9% above the 78% national score)
- In writing (which is teacher-assessed), 89% of the children met the expected standard (11% above the 78% national score)

Congratulations to staff and children for such excellent results in all areas. In all areas, our children's results were significantly above national figures.

Our average scaled scores for reading and maths, which are both above national levels, are shown in the table below:

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At the end of Key Stage 1, our Year 2 children undergo a [Phonics Screening Check](#), which checks that they have learnt how to decode words phonetically to the expected standard. The government set the pass mark in this assessment to 32/40 - in other words, that 80% of children would have met the expected standard. 90% of our Year 2 children met the standard - another excellent result.
